- As of 2022 the region's population **declined by 9.9%** since 2017, falling by 1,838. Population is expected to **decrease by 10.0%** between 2022 and 2027, losing 1,685.
- From 2017 to 2022, jobs increased by 2.6% in 2 West Virginia Counties from 5,529 to 5,670. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.8% by 1.2%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate increased from 63.9% to 72.5% between 2017 and 2022.
- Concerning educational attainment, **9.8% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (11.0% below the national average), and **4.2% hold an Associate's Degree** (4.7% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2022 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, and Restaurants and Other Eating Places.







Unemployment by Gender














Unemployment Rate Trends










Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Occupation Employment Concentration





Top Occupation Earnings






Top Posted Occupations


